BACKGROUND

- SPECIAL SESSION 2017, A LAST-MINUTE PROVISION WAS PASSED FOR DHS TO CREATE A COMPETITIVE BIDDING PROGRAM FOR INCONTINENCE PRODUCTS
- NO PUBLIC NOTICE OR INPUT, NO VETTING PROCESS
- A BI-PARTISAN GROUP OF ADVOCATES AND LEGISLATORS IMMEDIATELY OPPOSED MPIPP
- REPS. DEAN AND MURPHY AND SEN. BENSON SIGNED A BI-PARTISAN LETTER EXPRESSING CONCERNS.
- SEN. LOUREY HAS AGREED TO SUPPORT REPEALING THE BILL

IMPACT

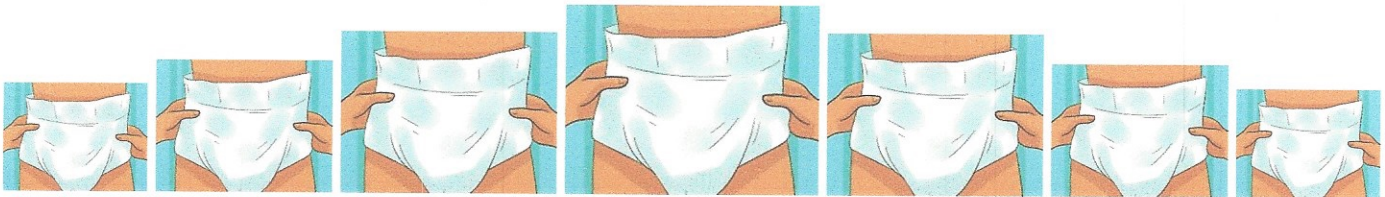
- MEDICAID SUPPLIED INCONTINENCE PRODUCTS ARE UTILIZED BY 14,000 MINNESOTANS
- SIGNIFICANT STRUCTURAL ISSUES STAND IN THE WAY OF THE MPIPP
- THE MPIPP WILL LEAD TO JOB LOSSES THROUGHOUT MINNESOTA
- THIS APPROACH HAS FAILED IN NEIGHBORING STATES

OLMSTEAD

- WITHOUT PROPER INCONTINENCE PRODUCTS, PATIENTS LOSE THEIR ABILITY TO BE OUT IN THE COMMUNITY
- MPIPP DOES NOT SUPPORT ACCESS TO CHOICE
- MPIPP IS NOT PERSON CENTERED
